## Dear All

I am delighted to welcome you to our first Newsletter of Session 2013-14 and to welcome your children back to school – I am sure many of you are delighted to have them back here too after the 6 week summer break.

We have had a busy start to the term, as you can imagine. Firstly, I want to take this opportunity to apologise for any confusion that has arisen over the school uniform this session. In our April Newsletter we noted our desire to introduce blazers for all year groups as an expectation. This was warmly received by parents and fully endorsed by our Parent Council. A letter was subsequently issued to parents at the end of June, which stated that blazers were now an expected part of school uniform for all pupils and noted where these could be purchased from. Unfortunately I have learned that a number of parents have not received this letter, thus there have been some concerns raised that parents did not know about this prior to the beginning of term. I am unclear as to how this miscommunication has come about, but can only offer my apologies for it.

As a Senior Leadership Team and as a school, we are working hard to drive up the standards of King's Park Secondary School in terms of attainment, timekeeping, behaviour and this drive for improvement includes uniform. It is important for us that all young people are able to identify with the school and also be identified as being part of King's Park Secondary School, and do not stand out from their peers in terms of not having the most expensive clothes, with designer names. King's Park Secondary School are one of the few schools across Scotland who had not previously insisted upon blazers being worn as part of the school uniform, therefore we are working hard to try to bring us into line with that.

All young people were spoken to about our heightened expectation of uniform prior to the holidays and also during Registration/House Assemblies this week and we would ask that you support us with this in encouraging your children to wear their blazer. Due to the confusion that has arisen, we understand that some parents will not be in a position to supply a blazer by the end of this month, but we would ask you to do so as quickly as possible. If there are issues with this, please contact to your child's Pastoral Care Teacher to discuss.

This session, we welcome a number of new staff: Mr Kevin Kelly (Depute Headteacher with responsibility for Skye House), Mrs Nikki Lyons (Principal Teacher of Maths and Numeracy), five probationer teachers and new staff in Technical, Biology, Maths, English, Computing and Religious and Moral Education. We welcome their ideas and enthusiasm, however, we cannot also forget the depth of experience and support our longer serving members of staff provide us with and are looking forward to the year ahead.

We look forward to working with you over this session and I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support.

### SQA Exam Results

We have had mixed success with our SQA exam results for session 2012/13. Our S4 pupils improved on last session's results at Foundation and General Level, but our percentage of pupils achieving 5 or more credit awards dipped. We are disappointed by this, but will work hard to ensure these young people are challenged in their S5 classes this session to encourage them to achieve their full potential. Our S5 results for pupils achieving one or three Highers were lower than the previous year, but the number of pupils achieving 5 Highers remained stable. Our S6 results were great and saw a marked improvement on the previous year.

Departments are currently analysing their results and are detailing areas for further improvement. A key focus this session is on raising standards of attainment and we will work hard to ensure your children are on track to perform to their ability and welcome the support you offer us in working in partnership on this.

### Dance Troup Success



Our Dance Troup - **Edge** were successful at their competition at the Emirates on Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June 2013 and have now progressed to the National Schools' Street Dance Championships at the Clyde Auditorium on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> August. #### KING'S PARK SECONDARY SCHOOL DRESS CODE

#### UNIFORM

- School tie (on sale from the school office £5)
- Plain white school shirt which buttons up to the neck short or long sleeve
- Black school trousers or plain black school skirt which MUST be knee length.
- Trousers must be black <u>school</u> trousers. Tight trousers, leggings, shorts, jeans, cargo pants, or fashion trousers of any kind are <u>not</u> permitted.
- Girls must a knee-length box pleat <u>school</u> skirt. We will not permit short skirts, short tube skirts, stretch skirts or fashion skirts of any kind.
- Black socks
- Plain black school shoes, or plain black boots suitable for school
- Black v-neck school sweater or black school cardigan or black plain zipper
- OUTDOOR WEAR A hooded sweatshirt for outdoor wear will be permitted, ONLY if it is plain black with a full-length zip, so that the
  tie can be seen at all times. Like all outdoor garments, it must be removed in class. Pupils should <u>not</u> wear brightly coloured
  sweatshirts/hooded sweatshirts in school.

#### **BLAZER-STYLE JACKETS FOR BOYS AND GIRLS**

- All pupils MUST wear a black blazer-style jacket with the school badge/pin.
- S5 and S6 pupils MUST wear a black blazer with the school badge/pin (and cord trim if possible).
- A high standard of uniform will be expected from all pupils of King's Park Secondary

#### HATS AND CAPS

Pupils may wish to wear these in winter on the way to school, but they must be removed when in the school building.

#### MAKE-UP/ JEWELLERY/HAIR/ACCESSORIES


- Light make-up only is permitted
- Jewellery should be kept to an absolute minimum.
- For girls who wish to wear a headband, a small plain black or white one will be permitted.
- The uniform should not be accessorised with gold/silver belts, chains, studs, etc.

#### **OUTDOOR CLOTHING**

It is essential that all outdoor clothing is removed, immediately on entering the classroom.

#### **PE KIT**

- INDOORS training shoes, navy t-shirt or polo shirt and shorts (or black shorts and black or white t-shirt or polo shirt)
- OUTDOORS suitable clothing for cold and possibly wet weather, including track suit bottoms. However tracksuits are only permissible from October until March. Indoor kit must also be brought.
- SWIMMING suitable swimwear. For example girls should wear a one-piece swimsuit or modest two-piece swimsuit, not a bikini.
- Pupils must bring PE kit for every single lesson. Even if they are injured and unable to take part fully in the lesson, they may be able to participate in a modified activity, and will be able to assist the teacher, eg with timekeeping. It is essential that they are dressed in PE kit.
