Former Captain – Claire Hunter

Claire has become the latest recipient of the Tom Harris MP Citizenship Award.

Claire Hunter was nominated by teachers after she helped raise hundreds of pounds to help build the "Glasgow Cares Community Centre" orphanage in Manila by running a car boot sale.

Miss Dougan, Principal Teacher of Pastoral Care paid tribute to Claire for her efforts: "She really took charge of the fund-raising for the orphanage. She's incredibly hardworking and responsible."

Tom Harris was "very impressed to learn of Claire's efforts on behalf of children living in the Philippines. She's an articulate and conscientious young woman and a worthy recipient of this award."

The Citizenship Award is sponsored by Tom at various secondary schools in his Glasgow South constituency and is awarded annually to a senior pupil whom teachers consider has contributed most to the principle of active citizenship.

S4 – S6 Tracking Pupil Performance

We have introduced a rigorous system within the school to track the performance of all of our S4-S6 to ensure they achieve the success that they are capable of in the forthcoming SQA examinations in May 2014. Where pupils are not achieving their potential, parents will be informed and pupils and parents may be invited into the school to discuss support plans and targets that would be suitable for individual children.

To support this system, we are also introducing a Mentoring scheme to help support young people with study skills, organising their time and target setting. S4 pupils who have been identified as suitable for this Mentoring support have already received a parental letter and are in the process of identifying their mentors. The Mentoring support will commence this month for S4 and will run until the S4 prelims in December. Pupils in S5/6, whom the school think would benefit from such support, will be identified and will commence their programme in December, in preparation for their prelim examinations in January 2014.

Noisy Nights

Nine Music pupils were given an amazing opportunity to work with professional musicians this term. The young people, currently studying Higher and Advanced Higher Music, worked with Red Note Ensemble's John Harris to compose music based on Creatures and Fairy-tales. The project was carried out during their music lessons and culminated with an informal concert where they showcased their compositions to their fellow pupils and families. Two of the composers were interviewed on the Culture Studio on BBC Radio Scotland and their pieces were performed live on air!

John Harris felt that the pupils 'really deserve congratulations for all of the hard work, dedication and inspiration they've put in - it's been brilliant working with their enthusiasm for it, too.'



Glasgow City Heritage Trust Photography Exhibition and Competition

Fifteen S3 pupils took part in a photography competition looking at historical shop fronts in Glasgow towards the end of last session. This competition, organised jointly between King's Park Secondary School (Mr D. Miller PT Art and Design) and Glasgow City Heritage Trust (Helen Kendrick), involved pupils taking photographs in Glasgow City Centre (aided with the support of Mrs Hutcheson our support assistant).

On return to the school the pupils worked in the ICT suite to download and develop the photography and after printing out their work, Mrs Ayed, along with Helen Kendrick, announced the prize winners for King's Park Secondary with the winner (Rafia Baqai) and runners up (Robyn Haig and Molly Beck)receiving an Amazon Gift Voucher. Our 3 prize winners were then selected to compete against other Glasgow Schools in a city wide photography competition with the work on display at Glasgow City Heritage Trust, 54 Bell Street.

At the beginning of September, Rafia (now in S4) was selected as the overall prize winner and we agreed with the final panel decision that her photograph is something very special.

Glasgow Secondary Schools Track Cycling Programme
