#### **Equipment**

It is essential that pupils come to school with the equipment which they need, eg pens, pencils, PE kit, etc. A small number of pupils are expecting these things to be provided for them and are taking no responsibility. This disrupts lessons and is unfair on everyone else. We are monitoring this regularly with Spot Checks in classrooms. This session we will take strong action, including detention, the removal of privileges, and parental interviews, with pupils who do not come to school properly equipped.

We seek your support in making sure pupils arrive at school with the necessary equipment. Thank you for your help.

School starts at 8.55 am every day, and we value your support in making sure that pupils arrive at school in plenty of time.

We need pupils to be in the playground before the bell rings at 8.55 am, because registration is a very important part of the day, and pupils must not be late.

Pupils who are late or absent from school should bring a note from their parent. A phone call is helpful, but we must also have a written note which includes the date(s) of absence. Thank you.

#### A REMINDER OF OUR DRESS CODE - BLACK AND WHITE

A reminder that school ties (£5) are on sale from the school office.

Thank you to parents/carers for your support in making sure that pupils come to school wearing the following:



- a white shirt or blouse
- a **black** skirt or trousers (Smart black trousers cropped, eg **to the knee**, are accepted, but shorts are not acceptable. A very short skirt is not acceptable.)
- black school zipped sweatshirt, or black cardigan, or v-neck jumper
- school tie. The tie must be clearly visible at all times
- black shoes

The following items are NOT acceptable:



- Clothing which is clearly unsuitable for a place of work, e.g. very short skirts, crop tops, leggings, shorts, very tight trousers, jeans, cargo pants, very brightly coloured and decorated shoes
- Jewellery and accessories which are unsuitable or constitute a health and safety hazard eg long pendant chains, large hooped earrings, heavy rings, diamante earrings, sequined or gold/silver belts, chains and studs.
- Heavy makeup and very bright or black nail varnish is also discouraged.
- Tracksuits, clothing made of flammable material
- Football colours
- Clothing promoting designer brands, drugs or alcohol.
- Pupils should remove all outdoor jackets in class, as well as anything not conforming to the guidelines for school uniform, eg bright colours, striped tops.



We do not endorse any particular shop for school uniform. However, please do not buy unsuitable clothing which is sold in some supermarkets, labelled as school uniform, eg very short black skirts, tight trousers, blouses which are unsuitable for a school tie, etc.

Some of the school skirts on sale in Marks and Spencer are of a suitable length.

#### **Our School Improvement Plan 2010-11**

School Improvement Planning is carried out on a 3-year cycle, and August 2010 marks the beginning of a new 3-year cycle. The School Improvement Plan has been prepared and if you would like a copy, please contact Mrs Barr. Our school priorities are given below.

#### **Curriculum for Excellence**

Our main focus for the next 3 years will be the implementation of Curriculum for Excellence. Curriculum for Excellence isn't only about the courses (Experiences and Outcomes in Languages, Mathematics, Expressive Arts, Health and Wellbeing, Religious and Moral Education, Sciences, Social Studies and Technologies); it's much wider than that. It is also about building a curriculum which gives:

- Challenge and enjoyment
- Breadth
- Progression
- Depth
- Personalisation and choice
- Coherence
- Relevance



... and which develops the following capacities in children and young people: that they should develop into:

- Successful learners
- Confident individuals
- Responsible citizens
- Effective contributors

We are going to focus on:

- Further extending Active learning (making sure that pupils are actively engaged in the learning, not passive)
- Interdisciplinary learning (pupils taking part in activities which involve several subjects, and which help them understand the relevance)
- Literacy across learning (literacy is important in all subjects, and we all have a responsibility for it)
- Numeracy across learning (likewise with Numeracy)
- Health and wellbeing across learning (likewise with Health and Wellbeing)

We are also going to work on assessment, using as wide a range as possible.

Other important priorities are:

Promoting a Positive Learning Climate – building on our existing good ethos, and improving it further

Improving Attainment further, eg the number of pupils gaining 5 Highers

Improving the number of pupils involved in the wide range of opportunities on offer. Creating a record of each pupil's achievements.
