A REMINDER OF OUR DRESS CODE – BLACK AND WHITE

A reminder that school ties (£5) are on sale from the school office.

Thank you to pupils and parents/carers who took part in the consultation about how to make our school uniform much smarter. As requested by parents, we have a recommended supplier – Marks and Spencer. Pupils and parents/carers have selected the following items.

Thank you for your support in making sure that your children come to school wearing full school uniform, and not fashion clothing.

BOYS' UNIFORM

- School tie
- Plain white school shirt which buttons up to the neck short or long sleeves
- Black school trousers
- Trousers must be black school trousers, for example Marks and Spencer T764620D or T763600B. Pupils are not permitted to wear tight trousers, leggings, shorts, cargo pants or fashion trousers of any kind.
- Black socks
- Plain black school shoes, or plain black boots suitable for school
- Black v-neck school sweater or black school cardigan or black plain zipper
- Following recommendations from the pupils, a hooded sweatshirt for outdoor wear will be permitted, ONLY if it is plain black with a full-length zip, so that the tie can be seen at all times. Like all outdoor garments, it must be removed in class.

- Plain white school blouse which buttons up to the neck long, short or ³/₄ sleeve. This must not be a fashion blouse.
- Black school trousers or plain black school skirt which **MUST** be knee length.
- Girls must wear the Marks and Spencer school skirt T760112R or a very similar knee length box pleat school skirt. We will not permit short skirts, short tube skirts, stretch skirts or fashion skirts of any kind.
- Trousers must be black school trousers, for example Marks and Spencer T761237 or T761225.
- Pupils are not permitted to wear tight trousers, leggings, shorts, cargo pant, or fashion trousers of any kind.
- Black v-neck school sweater or black v-necked school cardigan or black plain zipper.
- Plain black or white socks or plain black or natural tights.
- Plain black school shoes, or plain black boots suitable for school
- Following recommendations from the pupils, a hooded sweatshirt for outdoor wear will be permitted, ONLY if it is plain black with a full-length zip, so that the tie can be seen at all times. Like all outdoor garments, it must be removed in class.

BLAZER-STYLE JACKETS FOR BOYS AND GIRLS

- For S1-S4 a black M &S fitted **blazer**-style jacket is **RECOMMENDED**.
- For S5/6 a black M&S fitted blazer-style jacket is STRONGLY RECOMMENDED.
- A high standard of uniform will be expected from all pupils who wish to join the Senior School of King's Park Secondary, because senior pupils are role models for the younger pupils and representatives of the school.

MAKE-UP/JEWELLERY/HAIR/ACCESSORIES

- Light make-up only is permitted
- Jewellery should be kept to an absolute minimum.
- For girls who wish to wear a headband, a small plain black or white one will be permitted.
- The uniform should not be accessorised with gold/silver belts, chains, studs, etc.







Dress Code

On page 2 we give a reminder of our school dress code, which we expect all pupils to follow.

As usual, there will be a maximum of 5 nonuniform days this session. Pupils who wish to be out of uniform on those days should bring 50p each for charity.

- Date to be confirmed Sport Relief
- Friday 30th March (last day before Spring Break)
- Wednesday 27 June (last day before Summer)

At all other times, pupils must wear full school uniform.

UCAS INFORMATION EVENING

UCAS helping students into higher education

Wednesday 28 September 2011 at 7 pm

The parents of senior pupils who have expressed an interest in a university or college education will receive a letter inviting them to our UCAS Information Evening. The focus of the meeting will be to provide families with as much information as possible regarding the UCAS applications process, and to look at practical ways in which parents can support sons and daughters through the initial stages of a college or university education.

At this event, there will be presentations from Skills Development Scotland staff, the school, and the University of the West of Scotland schools liaison team.

However, we know that there are many younger pupils who are aiming for university or college, and we would be delighted to welcome their parents also.

Frequently Asked Questions

Holidays During Term Time

Children should attend school for 190 days each year, and every day is important. Please help them not to miss any of this valuable time. We hope that the answers to your questions below will show that your child's education is too important to take holidays during term time.

1. Can I take my child on holiday during term time?

As a parent/carer, you can demonstrate your commitment to your child's education by, whenever possible, taking your holidays during school holidays.

2. Will the school let me take my child away during term time?

Guidelines from the Scottish Executive indicate that a family holiday may only be authorised by the school if permission is sought from the school in advance, and the holiday is 'judged to be important to the well-being and cohesion of the family, following serious or terminal illness, bereavement or other traumatic causes'. The school will carefully consider parental requests, but the holiday will be authorised only in exceptional circumstances.

3. What happens if the school does not agree?

If the school does not agree, your child's absence will be marked as "unauthorised" in the school register, in the same category as truancy.

4. Why shouldn't I take my child away during term time?

- It is important that children attend school regularly if they are to benefit from the learning opportunities provided.
- While the child is on holiday, the remainder of the class continue to be taught by the teacher, studying new topics and revising. Children who are absent from school due to a holiday in term time will miss out on important learning. They may never catch up. This will have an adverse impact on their progress and on their examination results.
- Teachers will not be able to provide work in advance, unless the holiday is authorised by the school. Teachers have a fixed amount of time to spend with pupils and try to use it wisely. They will always do their best to support pupils who have been absent through illness, or have been on an educational activity arranged with the approval of the school. Time spent in helping a child catch up after a holiday is time which is taken away from other pupils.
